### New Member Auditions / Returning Members

Symphony/Concertina auditions for new members will take place in May from this season on. Auditions are required for all new members. Members who are returning must submit a renewal form only. Auditions are 10 minutes and a musician will be asked to play a solo, scale and sight-reading.

All MAYO Members (current and new) are required to take a seating audition in August or September of each year. All Symphony level seating auditions require an excerpt.

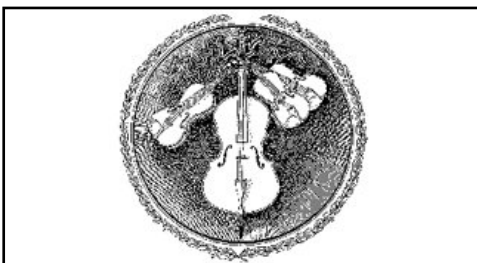

## TUITION / & FINANCIAL AID

**The Musical Arts Youth Symphony (MAYO) is a non-profit organization with approved 501(c)(3) status from the federal government. Parents and sponsors should be aware that the fiscal name of the organization is Southern Indiana Youth Symphony, Inc. (SIYS). All MAYO tax id forms will list this name (SIYS).**

Parents and sponsors should be aware that the fiscal name of the organization is Southern Indiana Youth Symphony, Inc. (SIYS). All MAYO tax id forms will list this name (SIYS). For Matching Gifts and Corporate Underwriting, you may see the abbreviation, SIYS as the approved organization. Please don't let this confuse you! You are still supporting MAYO, and you can write all your personal contributions & fees to MAYO.

The new tuition schedule is an all-inclusive policy. That means one price includes all miscellaneous fees, concert tickets for you and your immediate family (non fundraising concerts), rehearsals, concerts, and t-shirt. Please see the tuition schedule & policies below.

All tuition, registration fee, tickets, and financial aid are non-refundable.

All families who require financial aid must complete a financial aid form by September 10 or first week of rehearsal. The board of directors will issue a scholarship amount to qualifying families.

All financial aid families will be required to pay a \$50 annual registration fee (per family) due September 10 or first week of rehearsal.

MAYO will continue to offer monthly payment plans. This is an equal amount paid for 8 months starting September 10 and ending April 10. Students who elect not to continue the program and have performed in one concert will still be liable for the full amount.

The cost for a student to participate in one concert is equivalent to your tuition. Therefore, there will not be pro-rate amounts offered for students who join late or drop out unless the student does not participate in any concert (there is a three-week trial period offered).
